From August 1st to November 1st, in a partnership between Phoenixville First and the Philadelphia Museum of Art, high-quality


reproductions of the museum's masterpieces are coming to Phoenixville!



he University of Valley Forge (UVF) wishes to recognize and thank President Don Meyer, Ph.D., for his contributions to the community. For nearly two decades, Dr. Meyer has been a member of the Board of Directors to the Phoenixville Regional Chamber of Commerce, and for several years a member of the Board of Trustees of the Phoenixville Hospital. He has forged a lasting relationship with the Phoenixville community, which has brought many opportunities for the university and community to connect.

Making UVF an integral part of the Phoenixville community has been an important priority for Meyer. This has been demonstrated in various ways over the years. Meyer created Leadership Award Day – a day in which leaders in the community are recognized by UVF for their accomplishments and service to Phoenixville. Community Service Day is another example that shows Meyer's heart for the community. This is a 14-year tradition in which UVF students and employees clean, sweep, paint, trim, rake and mulch their way through the Phoenixville parks and neighborhoods. Each year, Meyer could be found working amongst the students. Meyer has often said, "We want to be good neighbors." Chamber events are also held on the UVF campus, and each Christmas the students of the Department of Music showcase their vocal and musical talents for the attendees. Other contributions to the community include photography services for special events, outreach services, and the ability to serve as an employment pool for local businesses.

It wasn't a surprise then, in 2015, when Meyer was named the 2015 Outstanding Citizen of the Year by the Phoenixville Regional Chamber of Commerce. During his acceptance speech, Meyer spoke of the love he and his wife Evie have for the town in which they have lived for almost two decades. "We discovered a family that grew around our hearts and our hearts grew around theirs."

Though Dr. Meyer's tenure as president of UVF has drawn to a close with his retirement on June 30, 2016, the university will remain a committed member of and to the community which surrounds it, through the strong and fruitful relationship that Meyer has built.



- Always follow the product label instructions
 - · Reapply insect repellent every few hours, depending on which product and strength you choose.



 - » If treating items yourself, follow the product instructions.
 - » Do not use permethrin products directly on skin

Mosquito-proof your home



- Use screens on windows and doors. Repair holes in screens to keep mosquitoes
 - Use air conditioning when available.
 - . Keep mosquitoes from laying eggs in and near standing water.
 - » Once a week, empty and scrub, turn over, cover, or throw out items that hold water, such as tires, buckets, planters, toys, pools, birdbaths, flowerpots, or trash containers. Check inside and outside your home.


